Meeting called to order by PIE President Nicole Evans at 12:08p.

Purpose Statement: PIE provides the students of the Spirit Lake Elementary School with activities and opportunities that support and extend their education above and beyond the classroom.

#### Principal Report

Mr. Huebner provided report.

Only 6 weeks left of the school year! Busy time of year for hiring new employees. Trying to find the right people in the right positions. Mrs. Frederich (2<sup>nd</sup> grade teacher) recently resigned; will be moving to Forest City to be closer to family. Seeking replacement; her spouse, Mr. Frederich, will be difficult to replace as well (IT Director for the district). Field Trips are starting to resume; 4<sup>th</sup> grade will be going to Sioux City to the Lewis & Clark Museum; 2<sup>nd</sup> grade will be going to the Washington Pavilion Museum in Sioux Falls. Spring Concert- May 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> at the SAMI Center. Will be similar to the Holiday concert with each grade having their own time slots/1 grade at a time, then emptying out the auditorium between grades. The 4<sup>th</sup> grade Track and Field Day will be held Friday, May 7<sup>th</sup>.

- 3<sup>rd</sup> grade participants presented their projects with their classmates in their classroom (no Open House this year). 4<sup>th</sup> grade participants placed on the tables in the locker atrium and students walked through to learn more about. 4<sup>th</sup> grade teachers said they preferred this way (no open house) and would like to revisit next year.

- PIE may do another banner this year to hang on the playground fence to reuse every year. Something to the effect of thanking teachers and to acknowledge them during Teacher Appreciate Week. Nicole looking into cost at Tri-State Litho.

#### BRAWL and 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Graduation Feedback

- Discussion about having a BRAWL (bike ride around west lake) & have a pizza party at the end. Feedback from 4<sup>th</sup> grade teachers; happy to combine these 2 events on the last day of school, May 21<sup>st</sup>. P.E. Teacher, Mr. O’Hagan, said “no on t-shirts and no on Gatorade stop (too sugary)”, but would be appreciative of PIE providing a water stop and providing lunch (subs or pizza?). May need volunteers to help assist with water stops/pizza. Will also provide \$ for stickers.

#### Book Fair Update

- Jodi Reinking, librarian, has not agreed or declined helping run the Book Fair next fall 2021. Will follow-up with next year. Still looking for any parent volunteers to help take over (instead of school librarians).

#### Scrolling Marquee Sign

- No updates currently. Continued discussion whether this falls within the mission of the Spirit Lake Elementary PIE organization. More information and details from the Scrolling Marquee interest group to be forthcoming.

#### Miscellaneous

- Question about 3<sup>rd</sup> grade swimming lessons (PIE has \$1,000 set aside for the budget). Mr. O’Hagan coordinates the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade swimming lessons at the YMCA; he stated that it is not going to work this year. A possibility would be to have the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> graders both do swimming lessons together next year.
- Discussed the possibility of a new enrichment/programming/workshops/opportunity for students next school year 2021-22 provided by PIE. Guest speaker? Will need to research and look into. Larger playground on east side is >20 years old and is need of some additional TLC/repairs also. Mr. Huebner is looking into contacting previous Boland Recreation to see what can be repaired and what can be replaced. Discussed additional future items of an Airnasium or a possibly a gift/donation to the Hope Rolls playground that is being fundraised for right now.
