Principal Report

Mr. Huebner provided report.

Winter Blast was a great success! Kids really enjoyed the non-traditional day of learning and activities. The activities were well-planned, and staff appreciated the \$75 gift cards from PIE to purchase supplies for Winter Blast.

The American Heart Association fundraiser ended last week and was able to raise \$8700 for the organization and a percentage of funds raised will be donated to the Spirit Lake PE program to purchase equipment.

Personnel updates: Two 3rd grade teachers, Mrs Tepfer and Mrs Mitchell, and guidance counselor Mrs. Thompson will all be retiring at the end of this year. Ms. Steiner, 1st grade teacher, has resigned and has chosen to be a stay at home parent. Mrs. Johnson will be transferring from elementary special education to the guidance counselor position and Mrs. Zinnel will be transferring from 1st grade to elementary special education. New hires include Ms. Maddie Vierkant who will serve as a special education teacher and Mrs Peta has also been hired as one of the new 3rd grade teacher. Interviews are currently ongoing for the two 1st grade teacher positions and the other 3rd grade teacher position. Playground Update: Currently seeking quotes with regards to surfacing. Chris Beck with Beck Excavating in Spirit Lake will be coming to make an assessment about the cost of the removal of equipment in order to pour the updated resurfacing. Another quote will be coming from Larry Rife with AB Creative in Des Moines to make an assessment and quote as well. Once decisions are made with regards to the project, it would go out for bidding to Beck Excavating, AB Creative, and all others interested.
