Adam Orban is the Wilcox Performing Arts Center Manager and Communications Coordinator for the Algona Community School District. Adam is a graduate of Morningside College (now University) and received his Master's in Music Education from the University of South Dakota. Adam taught secondary vocal music for 18 years prior to his current position. During that time he started two jazz choir programs and directed show choir programs. Over the years, students under Adam's direction have received numerous awards and accolades, including 1st Place finishes in jazz choir (including 1st Place at the Iowa Vocal Jazz Championships in 2015), 1st place and finals appearances for show choir, over 50 all-staters, and several Outstanding Performances at the IHSMA solo/ensemble festival. Adam has been a guest clinician for several events and his conducting honors include directing the 9th Grade Mixed Opus Honor Choir in 2013. Adam is an active composer of original music and arranges for area show & jazz choirs. Adam is happily married to his wife and fellow music colleague, Jill, and they have four children together.

Linda devoted her career to developing and nurturing students as they learned and performed a variety of music.

A versatile conductor, Linda led choral and vocal jazz ensembles in memorable performances at such sites as the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., Carnegie Hall in New York City, Orchestra Hall in Minneapolis, the Lionel Hampton Jazz Festival at the University of Idaho in Moscow, and the Cathedral of Notre Dame in Paris.

Her interest and vision for vocal jazz led to the creation of the lowa All State Jazz Choir. Linda's research and design led to a comprehensive audition procedure that is still used today, incorporating prepared ensemble and solo literature as well as literacy skills into the audition structure. The specially designed rubric helps to judge students on jazz concepts needed for high level ensembles. Her expertise in vocal jazz is in demand at both secondary and collegiate levels, and she mentors area professionals in the development of high caliber vocal jazz choral curricula.

Linda holds a Master of Music Education with choral emphasis from Drake University and a Bachelor of Music Education Cum Laude from Simpson College where she studied voice and piano. She began her musical studies by playing the guitar and listening to Louis Armstrong records her father collected.

Clay H. Blackman was fortunate to teach Choral Music to the young people of Nebraska for 38 years. During that time, he taught students of all ages from kindergarten through college. He has presented interest sessions at local, state and national music conventions and Magnet Schools of America Conferences on topics including vocal pedagogy, new choral music reading and building healthy relationships within the choral music classroom. In January of 2024 and 2025, he presented two Professional Learning sessions at the Nevada Music Educators Conference in Las Vegas. Earlier this month, he presented an "Advocacy 101" session at the Nebraskans for the Arts Hill Day held at the Nebraska State Capitol. Retired from Omaha South High Magnet School for the Visual and Performing Arts since 2014, he and his husband opened The Covered Porch Cafe in Stromsburg, which they sold 18 months later. Having failed retirement when he accepted a position teaching PK-12 Vocal Music and Assistant One Act Play director at Cross County Schools in Stromsburg. After four years at Cross County, he retired once again in the Spring of 2020. In the fall of 2022, due to a lack of teacher applications for the Vocal Music position, he agreed to "un retire" once again and return to Cross County on a part time basis. He served the Nebraska Music Education Association as Chair of Exhibits for three years and is honored and privileged to be the current Immediate Past President of the Nebraska Music Education Association. In June of 2024, Mr. Blackman assumed the office of North Central Division President Elect for NAfME and with that, a seat on the National Executive Board. He continues to maintain an active schedule as a clinician and adjudicator throughout the Midwest. Mr. Blackman holds a Bachelor of Science in Education degree from Kearney State College and a Master's Degree in Curriculum and Instruction from Doane University. He retains membership in the Nebraska Music Education Association (NMEA), the National Association for Music Education (NAfME) and the Nebraskans for the Arts. 

Michelle directed high school vocal music ensemble in Iowa for twenty—three years, at Pella Community High School and Center Point–Urbana High School. She began her teaching career at CPU, where she directed the High School choir, musical and show choirs (The Summit Street Singers and Pointer Sisters). She then moved to Pella, where for sixteen years she directed advanced choir, chamber choir, madrigal singers, musicals and three show choirs (AcaPella, Bravo and Durch Divas). Under her direction over sixty Pella students were selected for the Iowa All–State Chorus, and her show choirs won more than a dozen grand championships fifty–plus class championships and more than one hundred caption awards.

It has been Dr. Kurt Runestad's privilege to teach at Doane University since the fall of 2004. He teaches three of Doane's four choral ensembles, including the acclaimed Doane Choir, which under his leadership has performed throughout the United States as well as in 15 countries on 4 continents—most recently in Costa Rica, in May of 2022. The Doane choirs will tour to South Africa in May of 2025, where they will sing for and with the world-renowned Soweto Gospel Choir. Runestad also serves Doane as the music department chair. A native of Wayne, Nebraska, he graduated from St. Olaf College (Northfield, Minnesota) with a B.A. in music education, taught 10 years in the public schools of Iowa and Minnesota, and earned two graduate degrees in choral conducting from the University of Iowa. He is a frequent clinician, arranger, and adjudicator for choirs throughout the Midwest, and has published several arranged transcriptions of pieces by the Soweto Gospel Choir. Runestad has twice received the "Outstanding Teacher of the Year" award from Doane's Student Congress and has also been awarded Doane's Ardis Butler James faculty fellowship. He lives in Lincoln, Nebraska with his wife Carly Woythaler-Runestad, and their two children, daughter Avery (17) and son Owen (14). Outside of music and parenting, Runestad also enjoys reading, (mostly) organic gardening, camping, and travelling.

initiated the annual Elizabethan Madrigal Feasts, Heartland Honor Choir, Night at the PACs, and


along with Luke Miller, Iowa's only free All-State Camp. Brett serves as the advisor for the Laker




Meg Byrne VOCAL JAZZ CRITIQUE



Meg Byrne is the Director of Vocal Music at Pleasant Valley High School, a position she has held for 30 years. She directs the Chamber Choir, Treble Chamber Choir, and the Leading Tones, an a cappella jazz choir. During her time at Pleasant Valley, the Chamber Choir has been invited to sing in concert with multiple collegiate ensembles, the Nova Singers, the Quad City Symphony Orchestra, and was selected as one of the outstanding high school ensembles to perform at the Iowa Choral Showcase. The Leading Tones have been invited to the Iowa Vocal Jazz Championships for the past 16 consecutive years, and performed at the 2024 Midwest American Choral Directors Association conference. Her students regularly represent Pleasant Valley in the All-State Chorus, All-State Jazz Choir, as well as regional and national ACDA Honor Choirs. A 2024 Finalist for the GRAMMY Music Educator Award, Meg also teaches AP Music Theory and has worked as Music Department Chair and Instructional Lead for Vocal Music. She enjoys work as a judge and clinician with choirs and jazz choirs, and in 2024 was selected to direct the Ninth Grade Opus Honor Choir.
