Extra Comments:

-This year's season was absolutely wonderful. We had a very diverse group of 32 players with a wide range of skills. We were able to run more play options and challenge our teams to get out of their comfort zone. We made changes throughout the season highlighting players strengths and growth as skills and teams were developed. Our team focus was unity and building accountability as a team to be strong leaders on and off the court. We wanted to build a team centered culture where our expectations were high, our girls would learn to think of others, give back to our school, and positively impact the lives of others. We challenged our players to learn new skills, positions, plays, and techniques. As coaches you always need to be willing to learn, reflect, and adapt. I feel we have middle school volleyball coaches with passion, grit, grace, a willingness to study and deeper learn the game, and are developing an understanding that we are coaching more than volleyball. We as coaches are asked to mentor, work on mental toughness, help players overcome emotions that are building from outside of practice/games and affect them inside of practice/games, and positively connect with families. We look forward to coaching next year's 7th graders, and hope to continue to help build a strong volleyball program within the middle school full of athletes who enjoy the game of volleyball and want to continue to grow in their skills and understanding.

- We would really like the conference meet to be moved earlier in the week (Monday) or even into the prior week. This has been a perennial suggestion from MS coaches. We know you have gone to bat for us in past years and we appreciate your efforts to change this. We are hopeful that joining the Siouxland Conference will bring an opportunity to make this change. The present arrangement has left both Spirit Lake girls and boys programs at a competitive disadvantage due to our school year schedule. Dance recitals, graduations, club sporting competitions and other events take several of our athletes out of the lineup. All varsity teams have finished except for those competing at state when we run the MS Conference meet. Our suggestion is Friday, May 7th of 2027 or Monday, May 10, 2027. Resistance from other schools, we feel, was due to several factors such as a later start date for their season or a longer school year than ours. We feel we have accommodated other schools in the past and are advocating for a schedule that respects what works best for our athletes.
- This year the host school (Estherville) for the conference meet used Rapidtiming to score the meet. They also allowed four entries instead of two. This seemed to work efficiently. The only delay was due to lightning and a quickly passing storm that resulted in a 45 minute delay.
